

Words of Europe: A Journey Through Meanings and Visions

The WE Journey project has gathered two sets of keywords: **one reflecting current perceptions of the EU** and **the other focusing on the future of Europe and the European Union**. Both sets have been collected and analysed, and the results are as follows.

This report is partial, as the project continues to gather keywords related to the future of Europe. This ongoing collection aims to build a shared vision and explore new avenues for participation, fostering a sense of impact and belonging.

It also aims to highlight potential contradictions, conflicts, and spaces for dialogue and confrontation. Rather than being “representative” in a statistical sense, it seeks to be a journey of meaning and exploration, uncovering insights and perspectives to foster genuine spaces of participation.

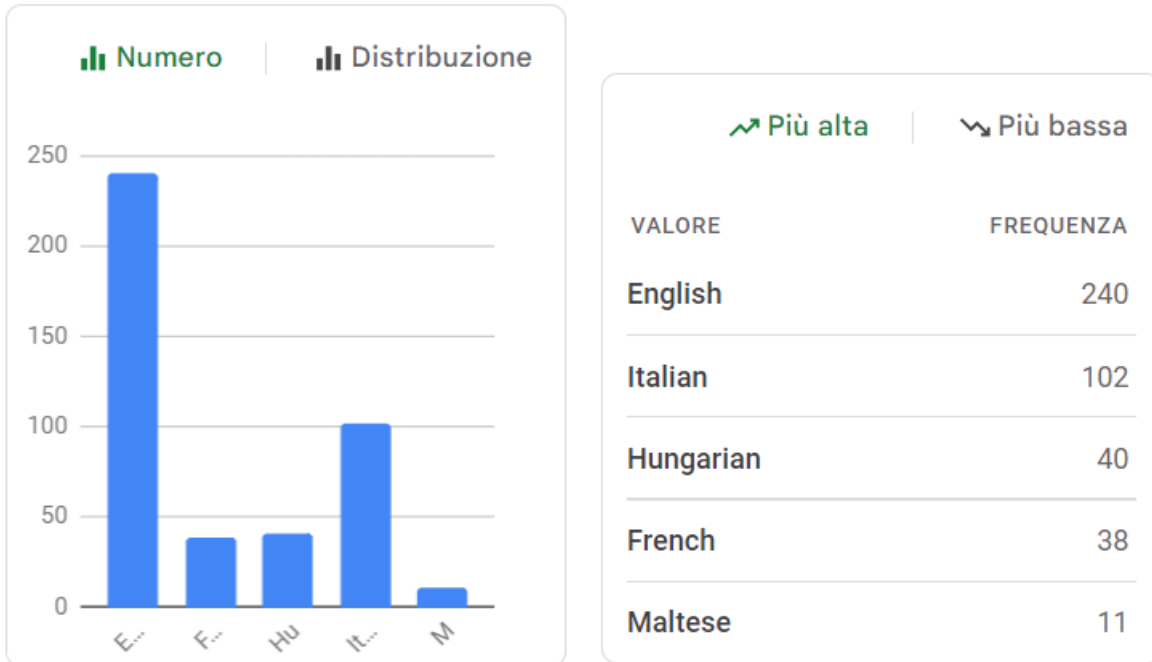

KEYWORDS EXPLAINING THE CURRENT PERCEPTION OF THE EU

The languages represented are mostly from the implementing countries, with a significant majority in English. This is because many of the international participants used English as the common language to share their ideas. While we cannot specify the exact number of countries reached, we know that one of the partners, due to its international nature, disseminated the information through a broad network across Europe.

Reflections about key topics and meanings

Positive and negative qualities

Many participants chose to use adjectives to describe their views of the current EU. We classified these adjectives into three main domains: negative qualities, positive qualities, and neutral qualities. We recognize that this exercise inherently shapes meanings as we make these classifications. It is not intended to be “definitive” or to reveal the ultimate reality behind the words, but rather to serve as a tool for navigating perceptions. As anticipated, we found a near-equal division between negative and positive qualities, reflecting conflicting opinions about the EU and highlighting areas where some participants see room for improvement. Some negative terms, in fact, do not necessarily carry a negative connotation but may indicate potential areas for enhancement.

In analyzing the keywords identified by survey participants and classified as negative qualities, several recurring themes emerge. The most frequently cited terms reflect concerns about the EU's complexity and bureaucratic nature. Words such as **"bureaucratic"** and **"complex"** appear numerous times,

indicating a widespread perception that the EU's processes and structure are overly intricate and cumbersome. Other notable keywords include **"disconnected"** and **"divided,"** which suggest a sense of detachment and fragmentation within the EU.

Participants also highlighted issues related to the EU's governance and effectiveness, with terms like **"authoritarian," "incompetent,"** and **"imperial"** indicating dissatisfaction with its decision-making and influence. **"Confused"** and **"ambivalent"** point to uncertainty and mixed feelings about the EU's direction and policies. Additionally, **"corrupted," "capitalistic,"** and **"exclusive"** reflect concerns about economic influences and perceived elitism.

Overall, these keywords collectively paint a picture of the EU as a complex, often opaque entity that is seen as struggling with cohesion, responsiveness, and relevance to everyday citizens. This feedback underscores the need for reforms aimed at addressing these concerns and improving the EU's engagement with its diverse population.

In examining the keywords identified by survey participants and classified as positive qualities, several prominent themes stand out. The keywords "**united**" and "**connected**" highlight a sense of cohesion and solidarity within the EU, suggesting that participants value the unity and collaborative spirit of the Union. Terms like "**ambitious**," "**progressive**," and "**innovative**" reflect a recognition of the EU's forward-thinking approach and its role in driving positive change.

Participants also appreciated the "**safe**," "**secure**," and "**peaceful**" environment the EU provides, along with its "**cosmopolitan**" and "**interconnected**" nature, which underscores its global engagement and diverse character. The presence of terms like "**empowered**" and "**motivated**" further suggests a positive perception of the opportunities and dynamic environment within the EU.

Overall, these positive keywords collectively depict the EU as a place of opportunity, safety, and democratic values, with a strong emphasis on unity and progress. This feedback highlights the appreciation for the EU's role in fostering collaboration, inclusivity, and a sense of security among its members.

The "**Quality (neutral)**" category includes terms that describe the EU's attributes objectively. It highlights the EU's vast scope (**Big**), wide-ranging nature (**Broad**), and traditional tendencies (**Conservative**). It also points to the EU's potential for improvement (**Perfectible**), structured organization (**Arranged**), and competitive economic environment (**Competitive**). Terms like **Abstract** and **Ironic** suggest complexities and contradictions in how the EU is perceived.

Approaches

In some cases, participants chose to share a noun or a short sentence to express their views on the status, perceived problems or potential ambitions for the future. For these responses, we used the category "approach" to summarize these meanings.

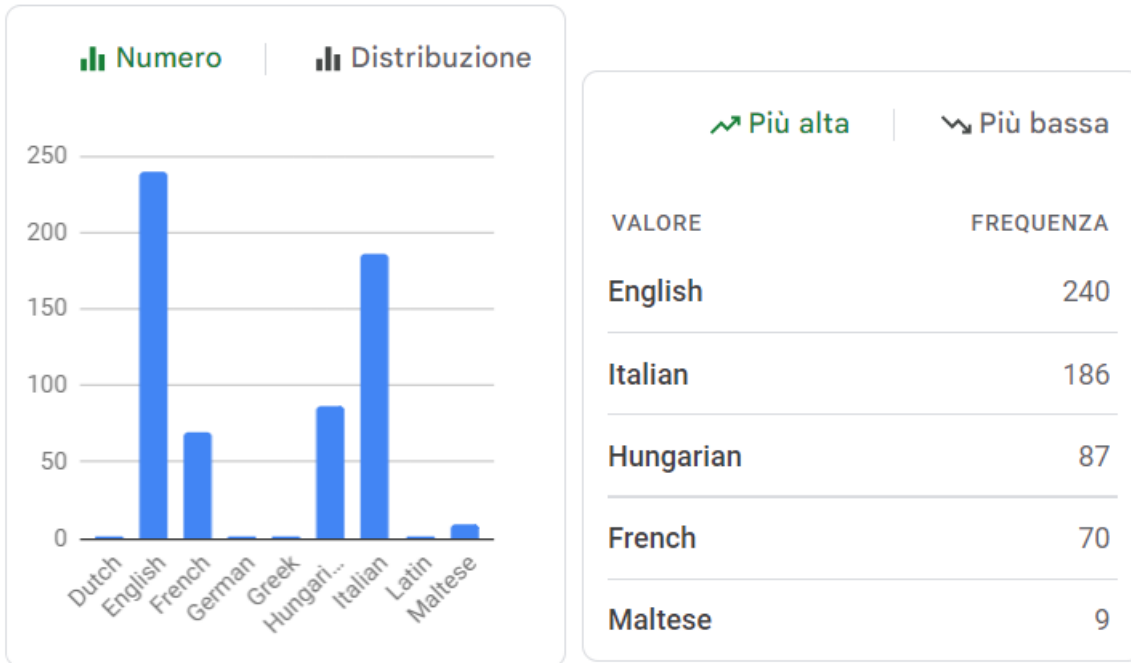
